JORDIN TOOTOO COMES TO FORT McMURRAY

Bouchier partnered with the Fort McKay Hockey Society to promote Mental Health Awareness to Aboriginal students in the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo. This was accomplished in conjunction with Fort McKay Hockey Week from May 6–10, 2015.

On Wednesday, May 6th from 12:00PM to 2:00PM at the Syncrude Sport and Wellness Field House, over 600 students participated in a speaker series with special guest Jordin TooToo. Tootoo is the biggest role model for Aboriginal athletes. In a time when Aboriginals are getting caught up in substance abuse and suicide, Tootoo is a ray of hope for everyone. His success proves that anyone can avoid the troubled lifestyle that has turned up in The Canadian North. His story is an inspirational one and one that he uses to help keep other kids from making poor choices. As a youth, Tootoo won the National Aboriginal Achievement Award (National Aboriginal Achievement Awards, 2002). This was the start of Tootoo's success, and even at a young age, people could look at Tootoo and see a person who was on a path to success. He later was chosen to be the spokesperson for the National Aboriginal Role Model Program because of his success. Tootoo takes his position as a role model very seriously because he is aware of the troubles his people are facing, and he knows he can be influential in the decisions they make.

On Wednesday evening, a banquet concluded the speaker series from 6:00PM – 11:00PM at the Sawridge Inn and Conference Centre. It was a successful evening with guest speakers and live entertainment.

JORDIN TOOTOO COMES TO FORT MCMURRAY

When it comes to Fort McMurray, railroad tracks may be hard to find, but that didn't stop students from getting a first class ticket on the Tootoo train Wednesday to kick off Fort McKay's Hockey Week.

Tootoo's visit, which connected him with students from the surrounding areas of the region, including Fort McKay, Janvier, Conklin and Fort Chipewyan, gave him an opportunity to share moments from his rollercoaster ride through his active 12-year National Hockey League career.

"I've been through a lot of ups and downs throughout my life and I'm still young, but I think my story, a lot of these kids can relate to," Tootoo said after spending time addressing students from around the region and answering questions from the crowd.

"At the end of the day, it's about believing in yourself and when you have a chance to see different parts of the world to not be afraid and to have an open mind."

Tootoo, who has become known to opponents as a bruising victim and a pest on the ice, racking up 880 penalty minutes in 607 career game, shed that persona for the afternoon, sharing stories from his entrance into rehab while with the Nashville Predators and death of his brother and teammate, Terence.

"I'm proud as a person from Nunavut that he dealt with the issues," Fort McKay's director of community services Simon Adams said. "He's a great role model, his career is back on track, he's had one of the better years he's had playing hockey so I think it's a good story that the kids see the personal side of Jordin, not (just) his hockey side."

When it came to opening up about his past, Tootoo shared as much as he could, leaving some elements out that he had included in his new book, but his overall message after talking with students centred around owning all his decisions in the past, good and bad.

"I don't regret nothing that I've experienced in my life," Tootoo said. "Everyone goes through life differently and everything that I've experienced I'm grateful for. It's brought me to the person I am today and I look forward to being an even better person tomorrow."
